

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Prepare and lay bricks, concrete blocks, structural tiles or other masonry units
- Read sketches and blueprints to calculate required materials
- Cut and trim bricks and concrete blocks to specification using hand and power tools
- Build patios, garden walls and other decorative installations
- Lay or install firebricks to line industrial chimneys and smokestacks
- Line or reline furnaces, kilns, boilers and similar installations

WHAT YOU'LL NEED to become a bricklayer

Entrance Requirements

High School:

Grade 10

Apprenticeship Program: 4 years, includes completion of 3-8 weeks of technical training at Saskatchewan Polytechnic, 5,400 hours on-the-job training and exam. Journeyperson certificate awarded after successful completion. As an apprentice, you also earn while you learn.
